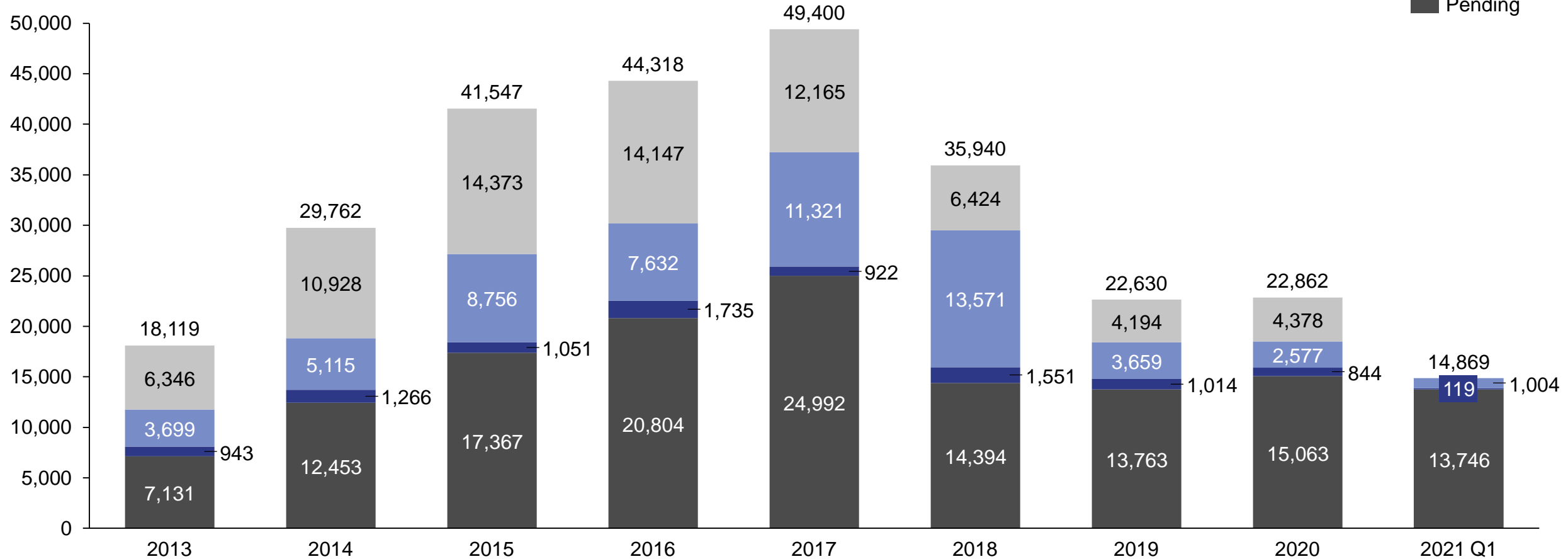

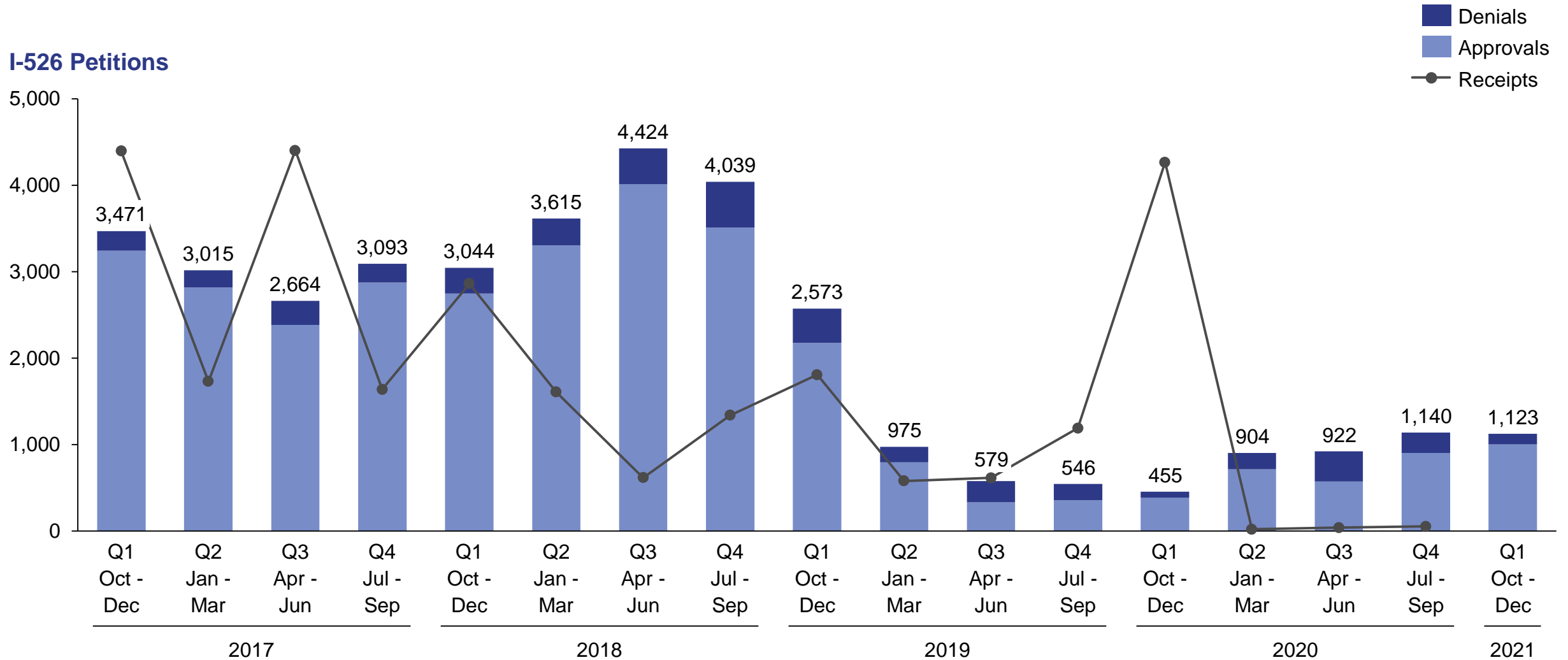

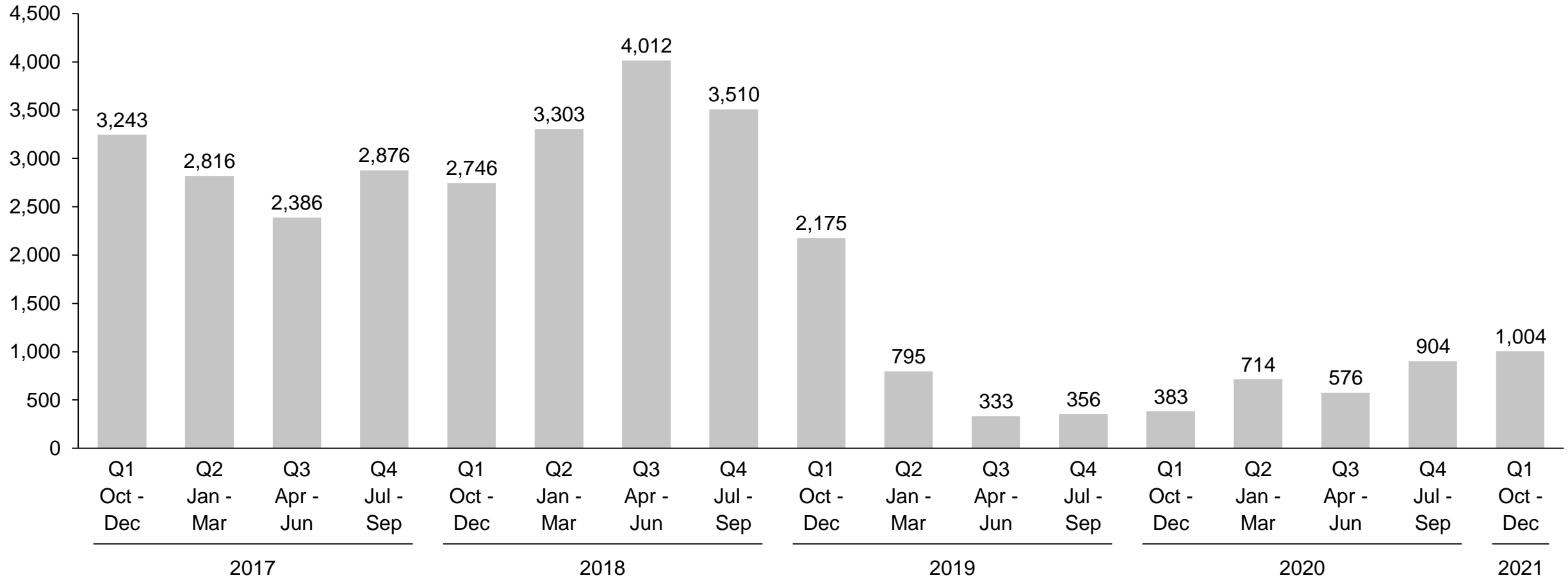

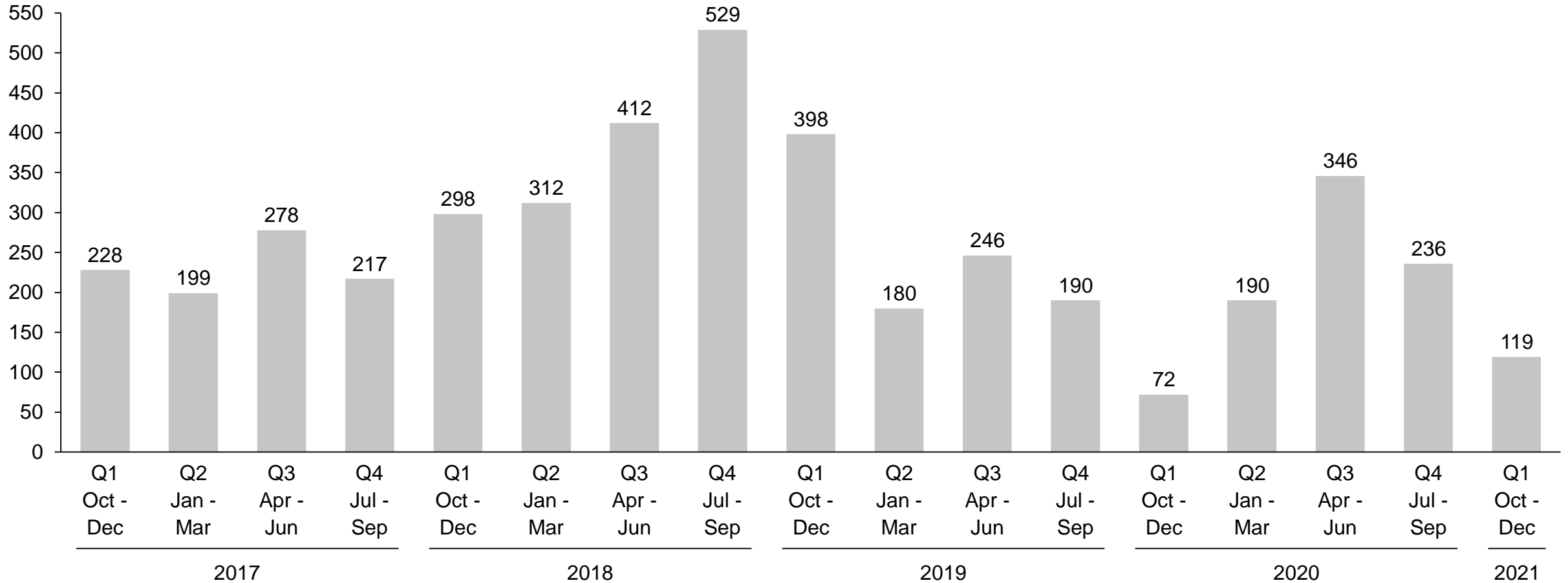

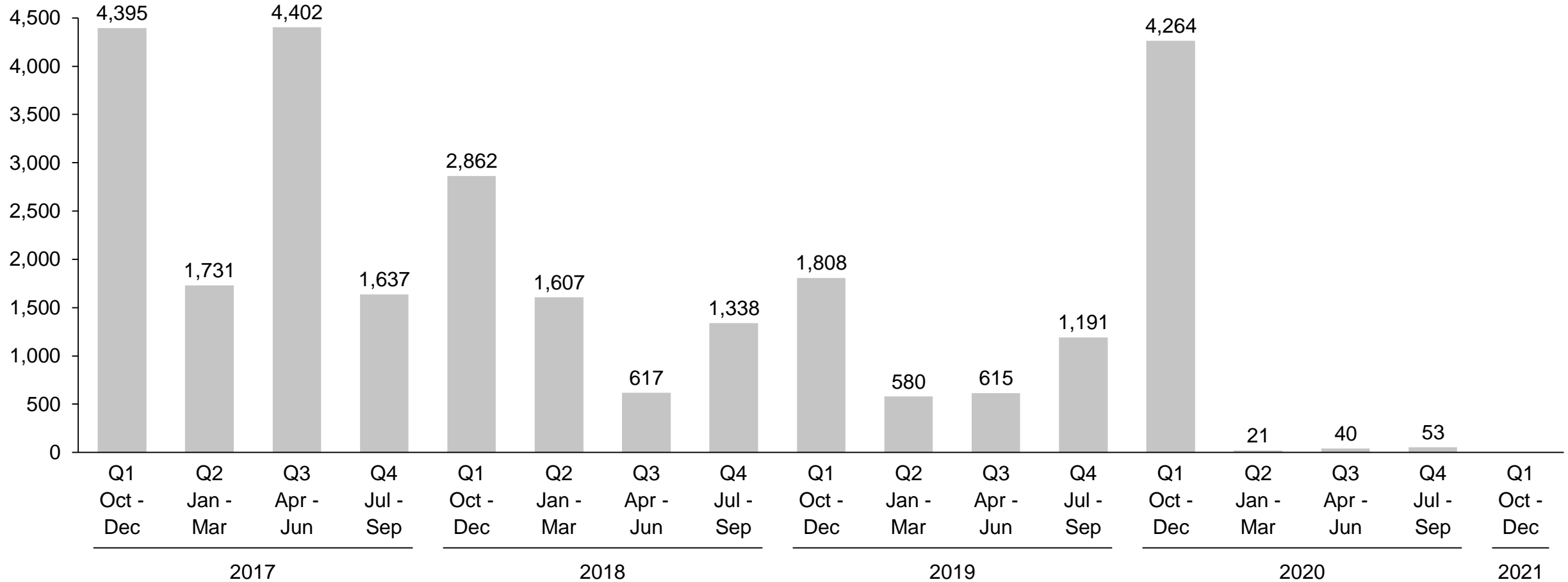

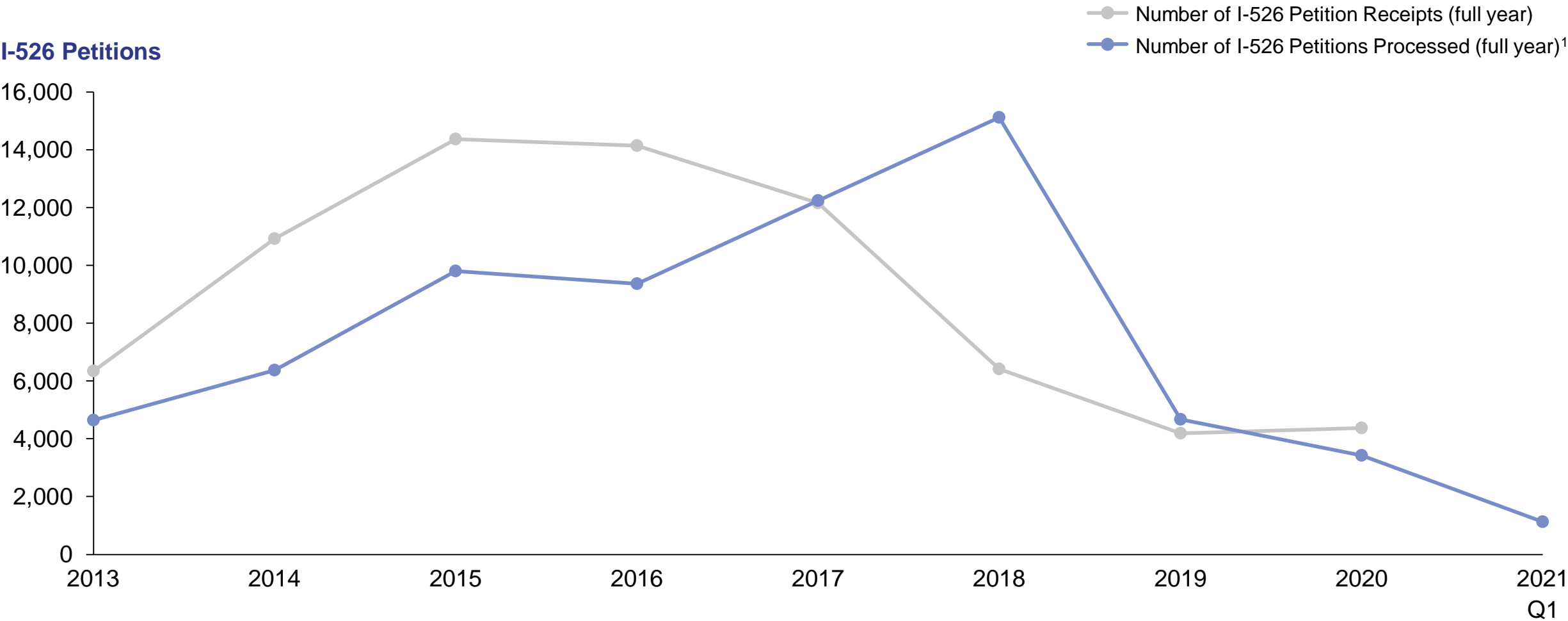

I-526 Petition Receipts Versus Processing

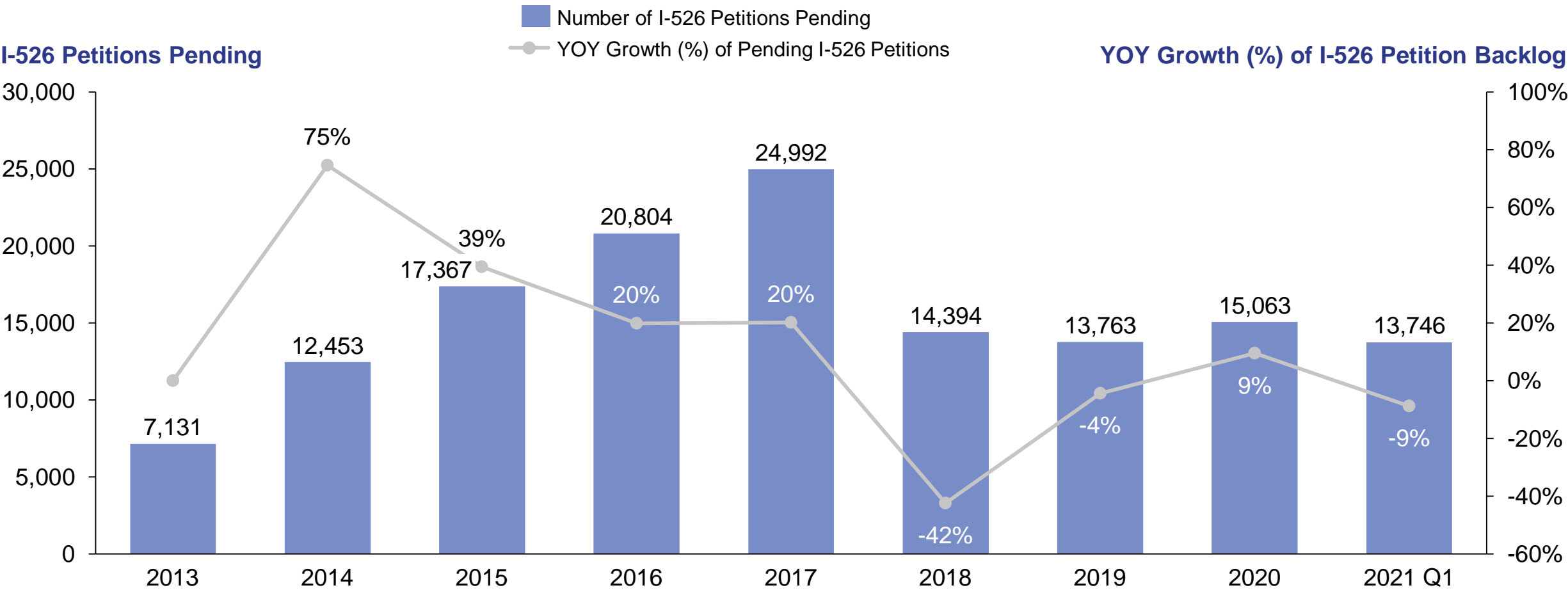
By fiscal year, FY2013–2021 Q1

I-526 Petitions Pending and Year-Over-Year Backlog Growth

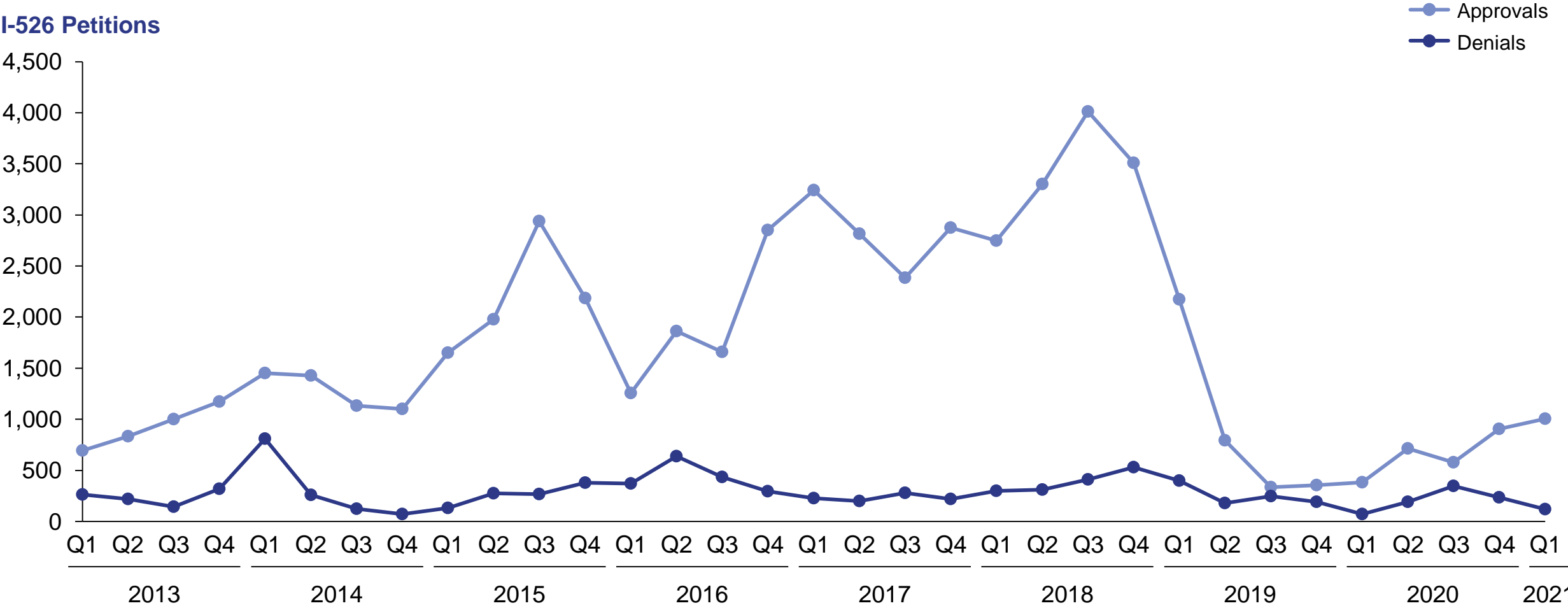

I-526 Petition Approval and Denial Trends

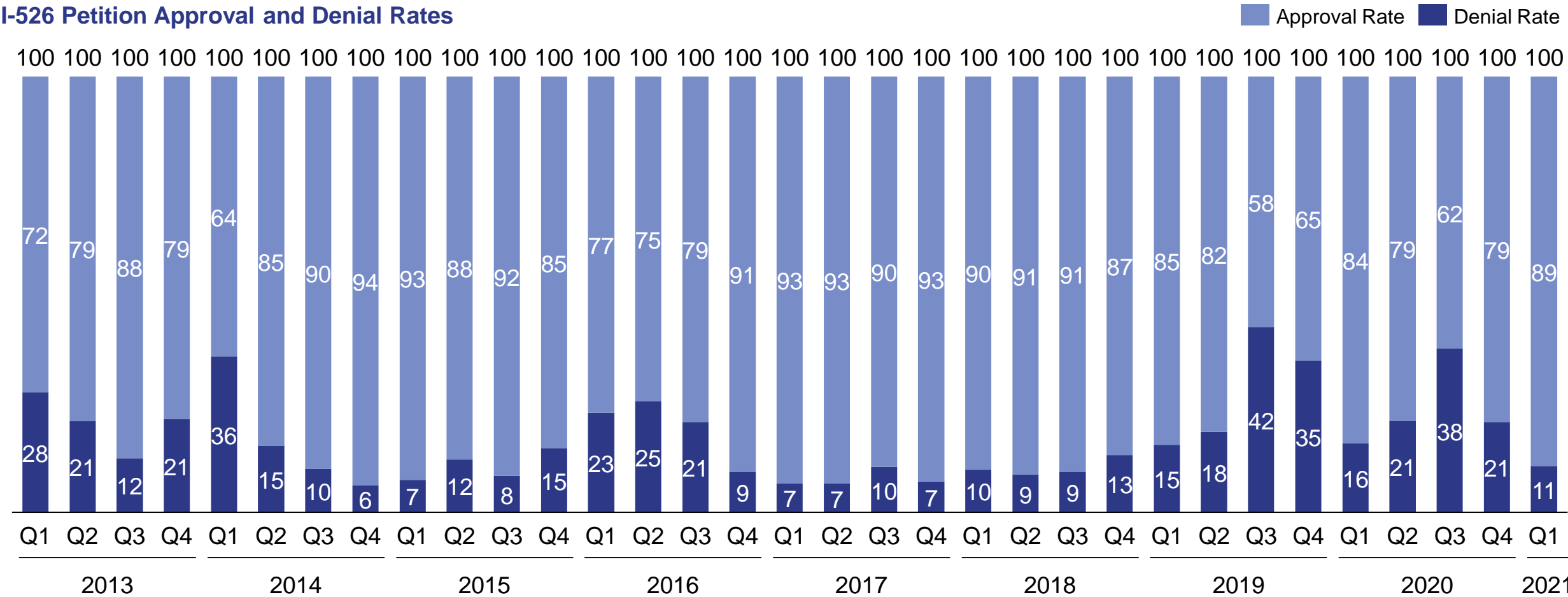
By quarter, FY2013–2021 Q1

I-526 Petition Approval and Denial Rates

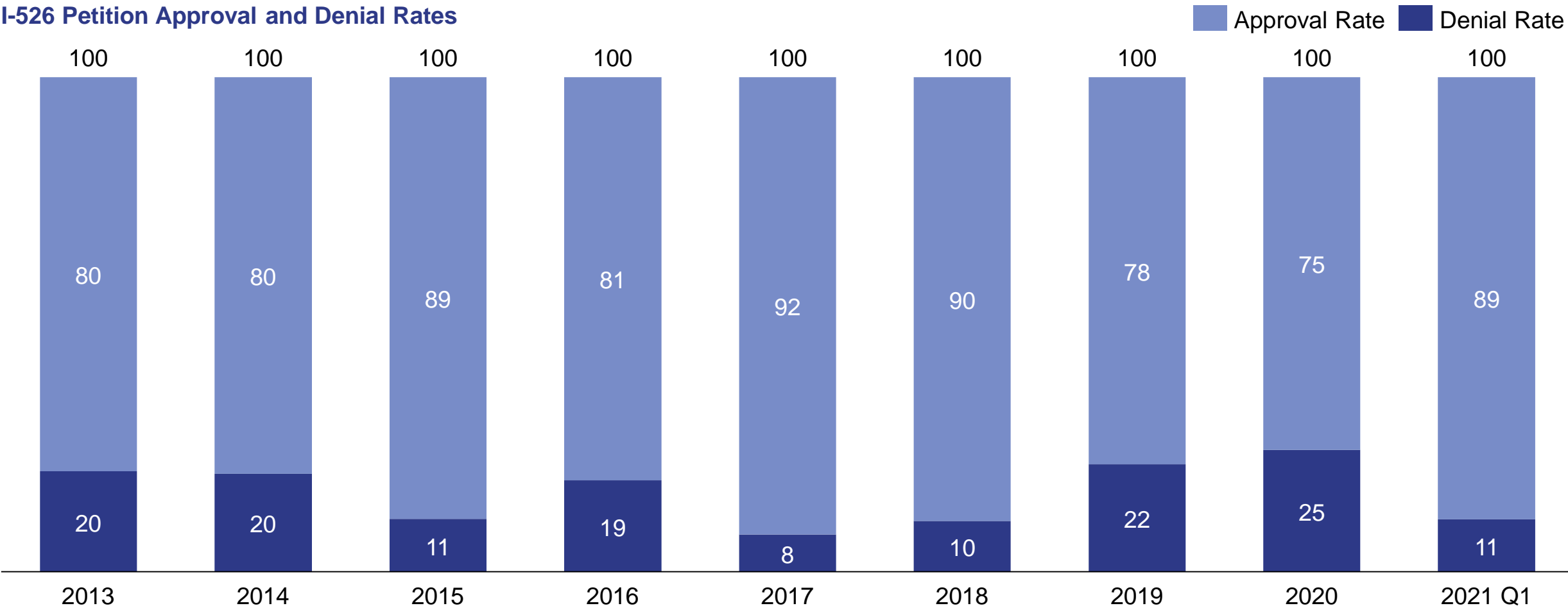

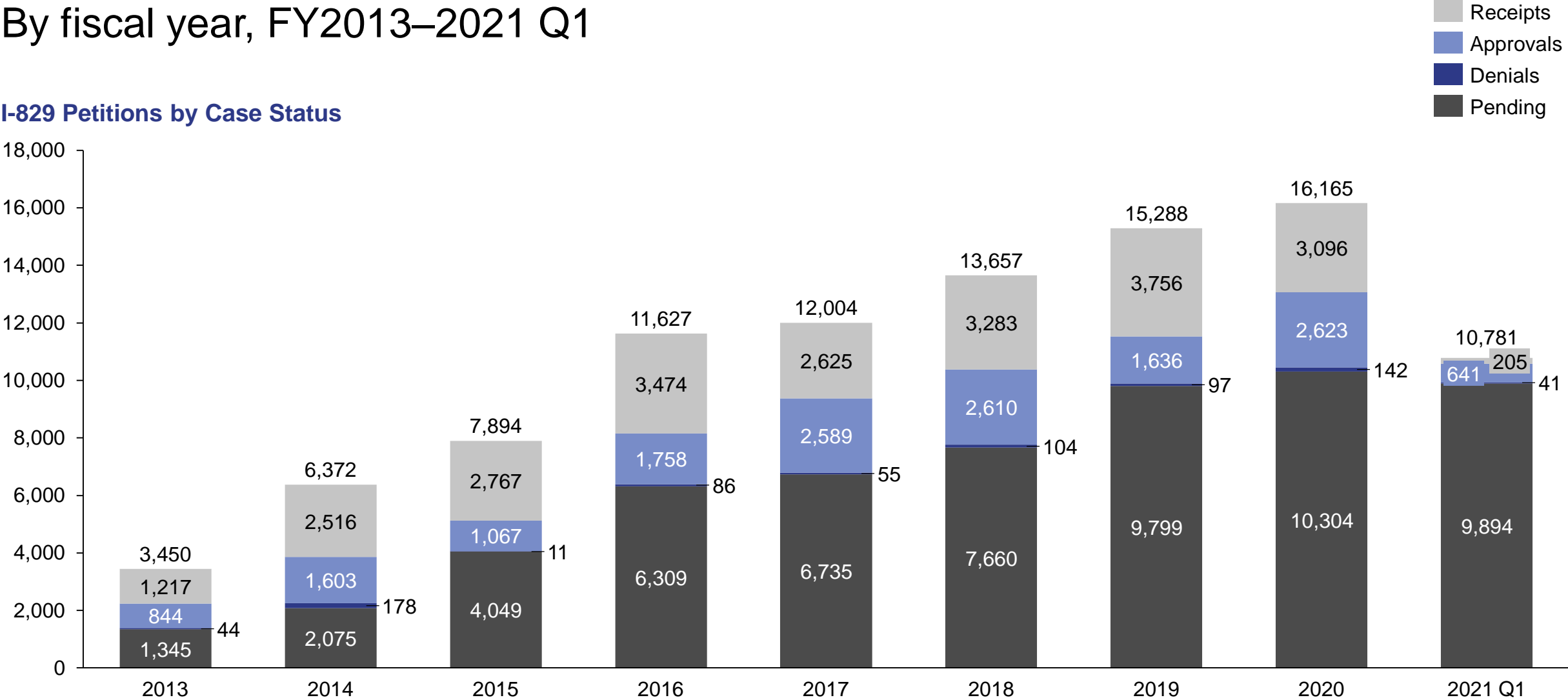

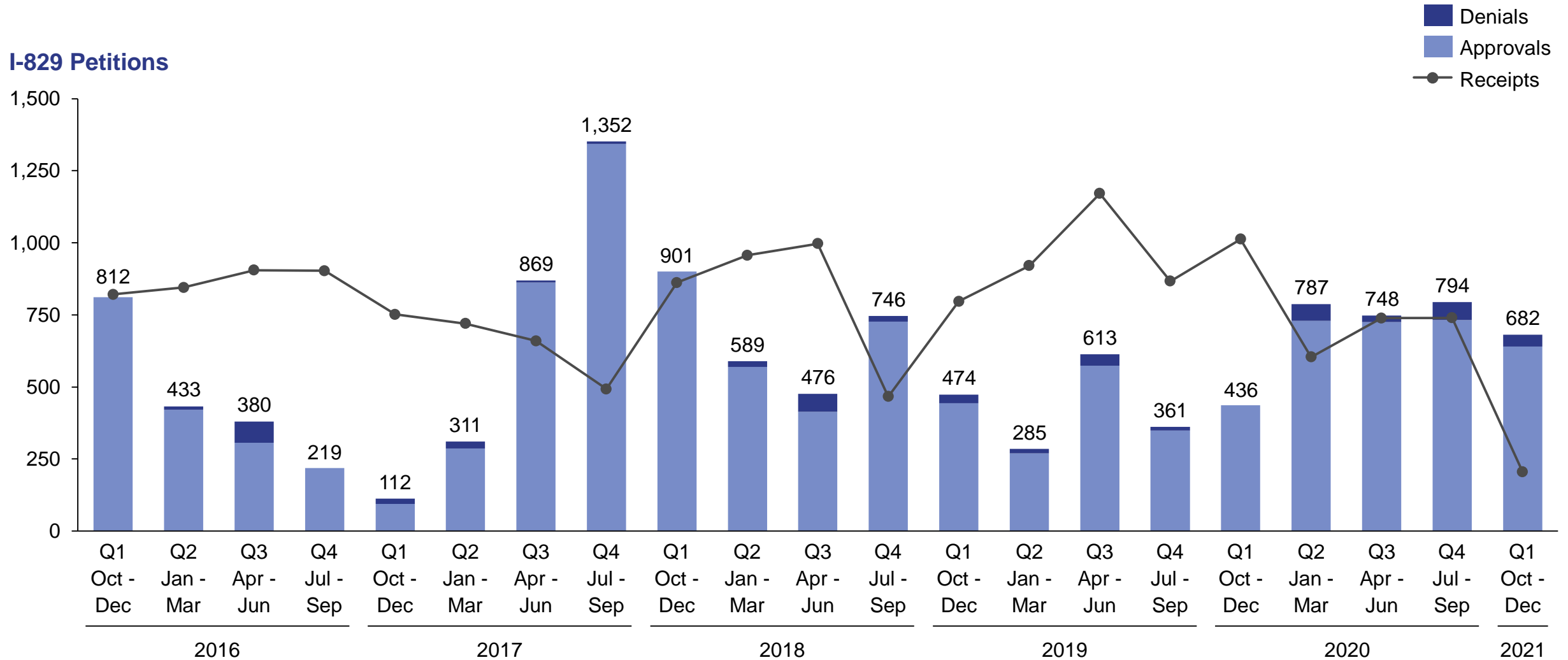

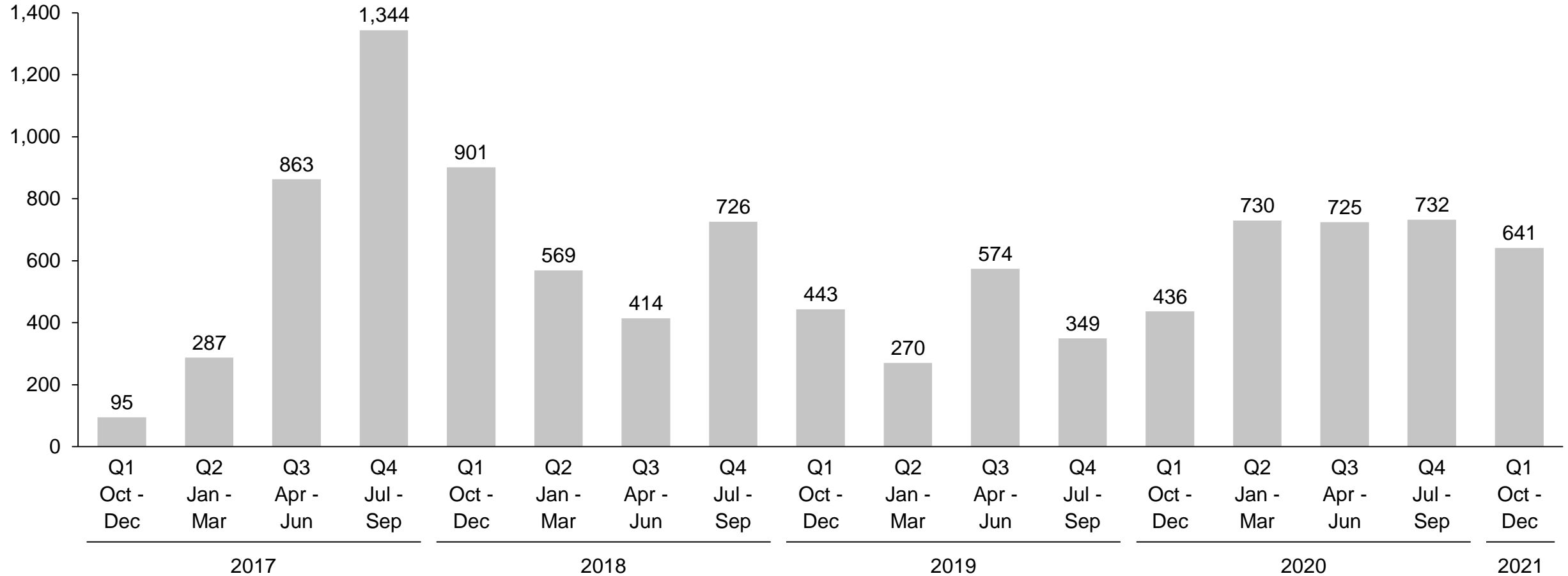

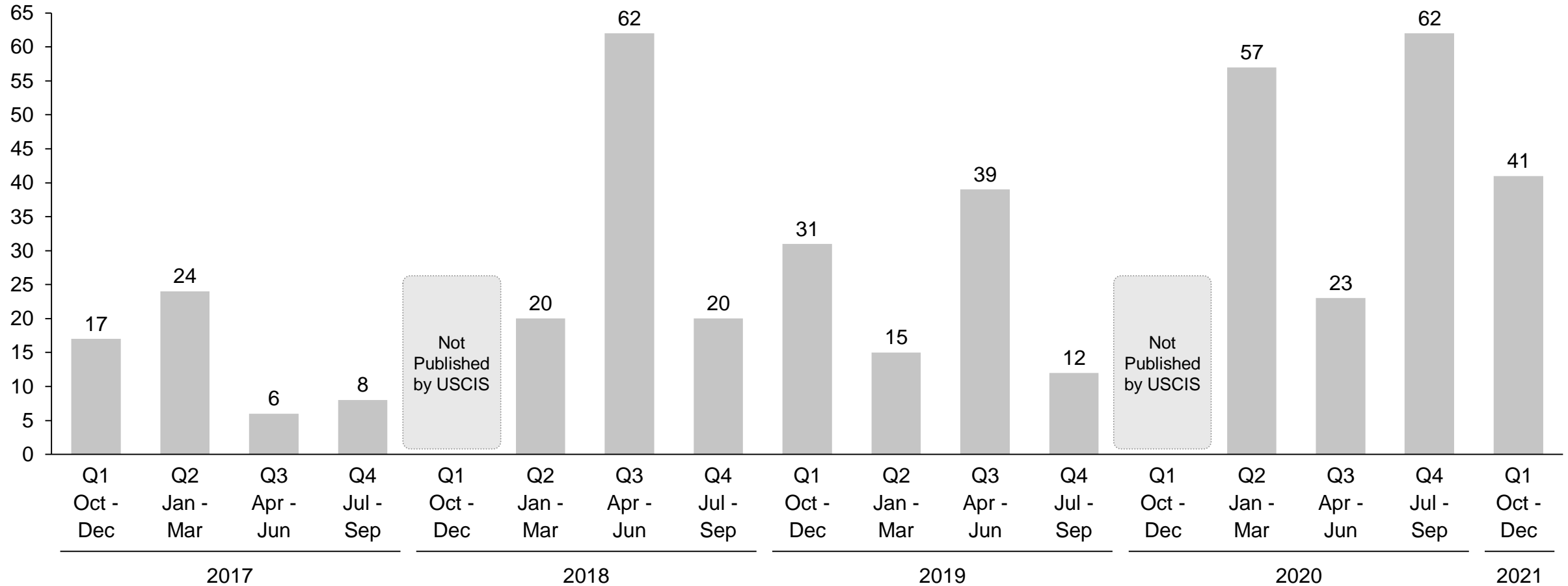

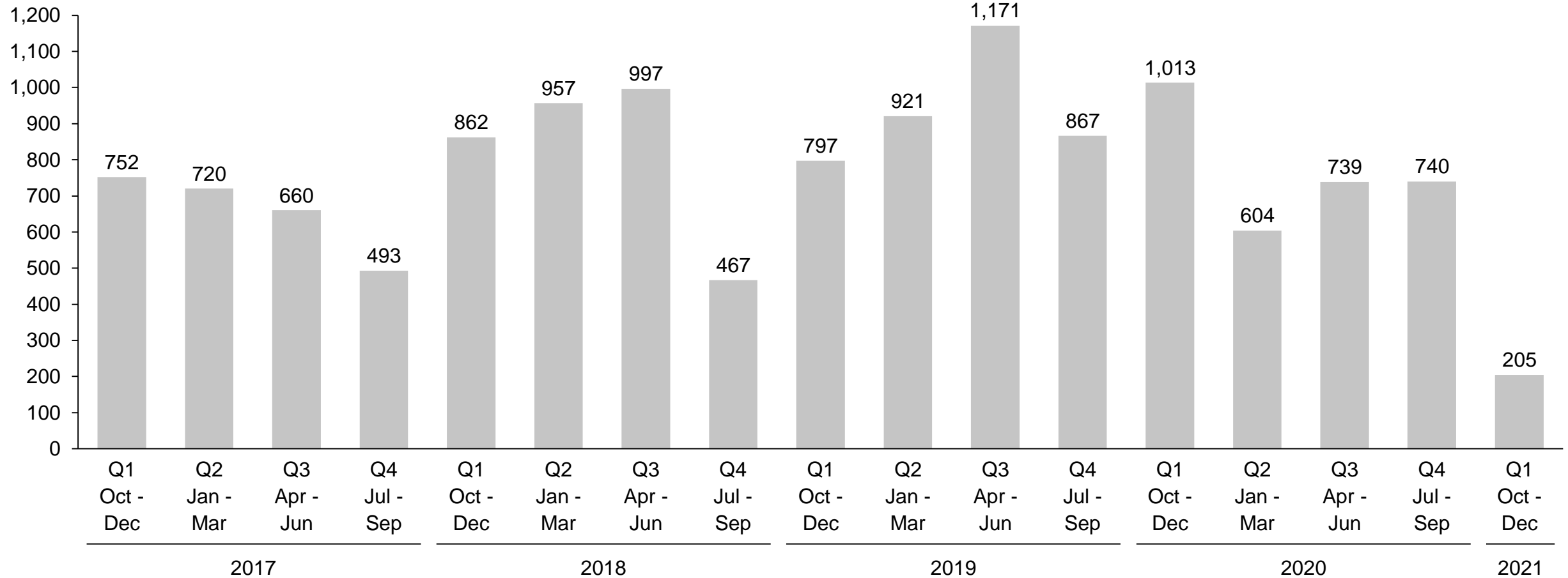

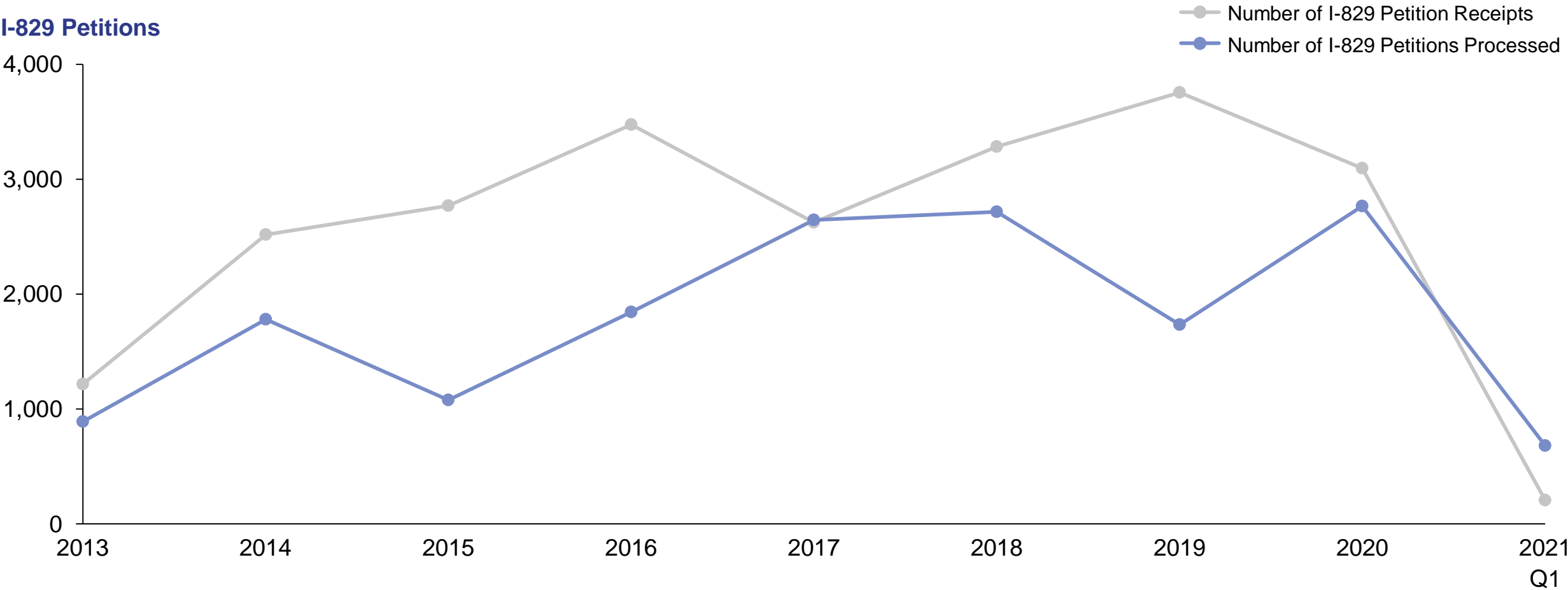

I-829 Petition Receipts Versus Processing

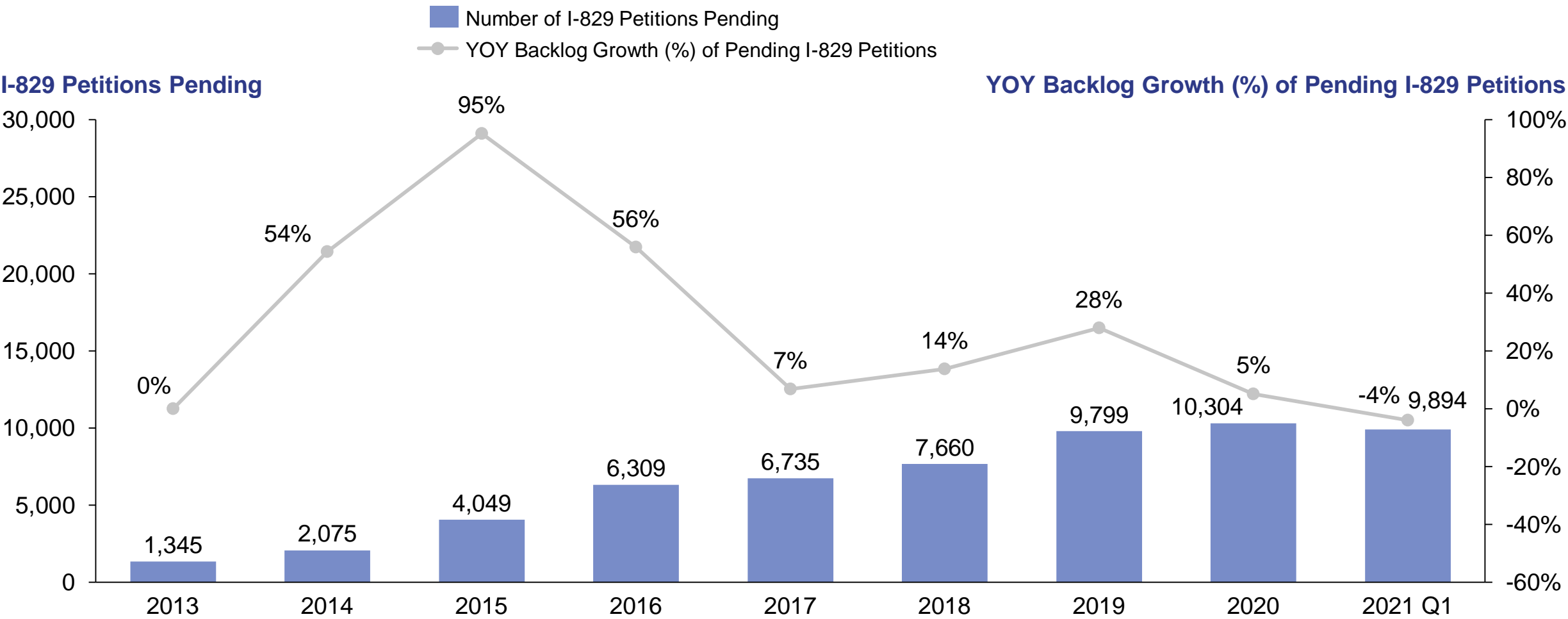
By fiscal year, FY2013–2021 Q1

I-829 Petitions Pending and Year-Over-Year Backlog Growth

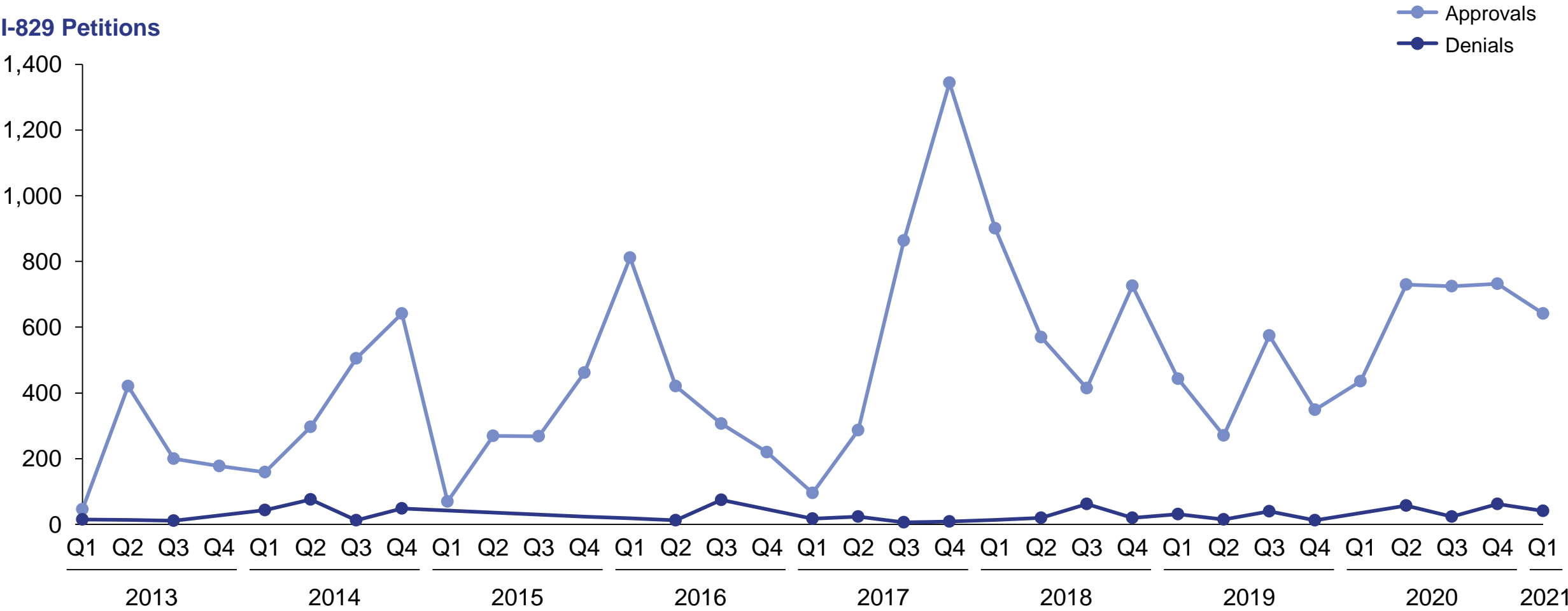

I-829 Petition Approval and Denial Trends

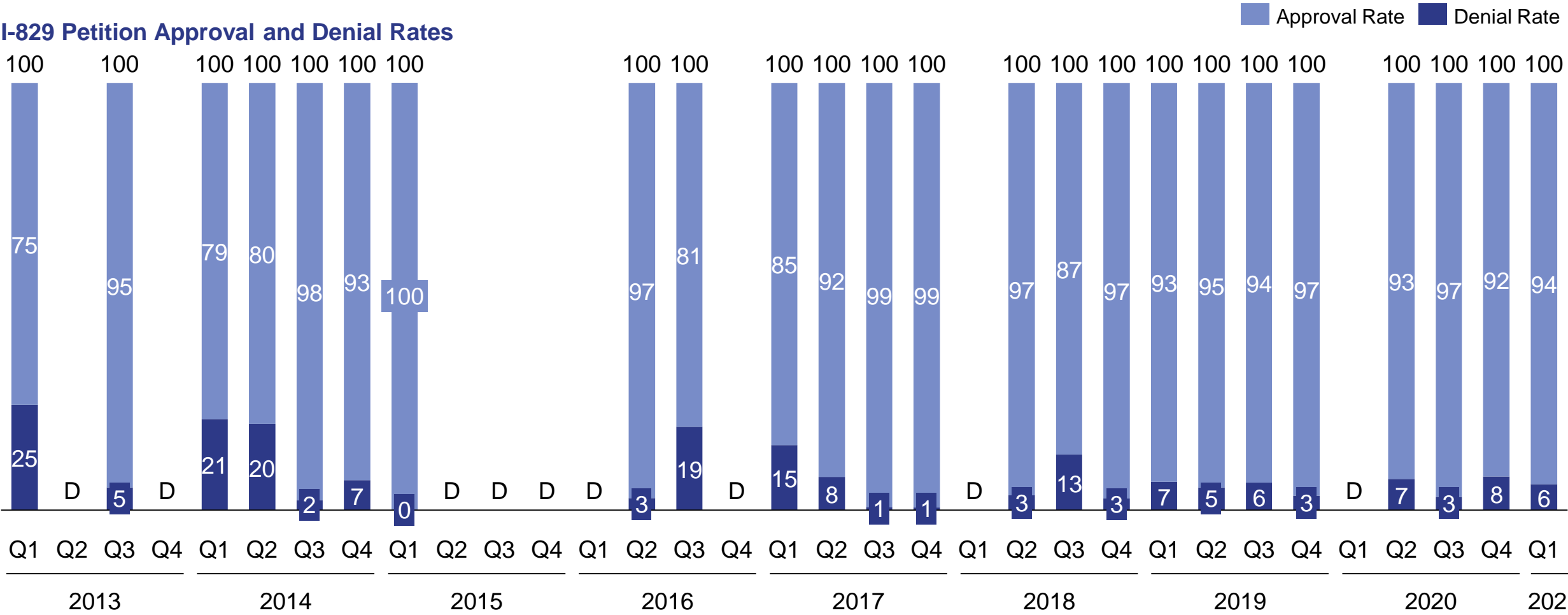
By quarter, FY2013–2021 Q1

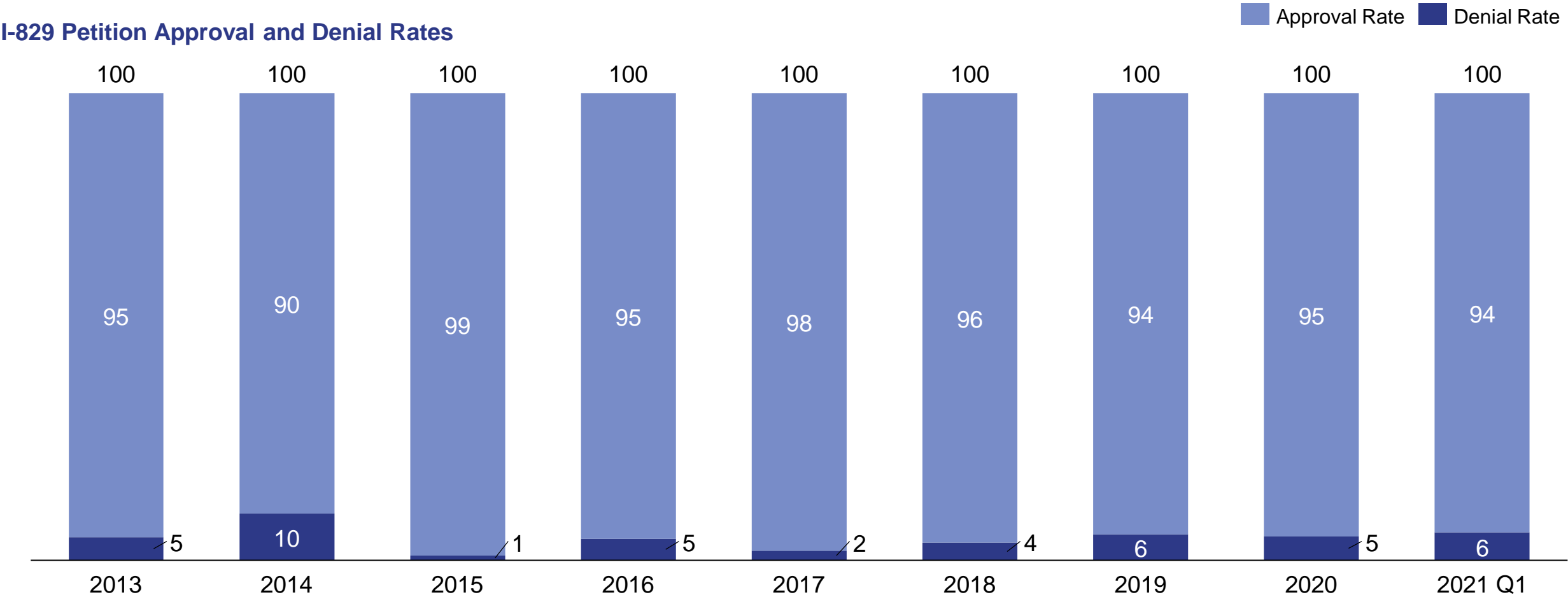

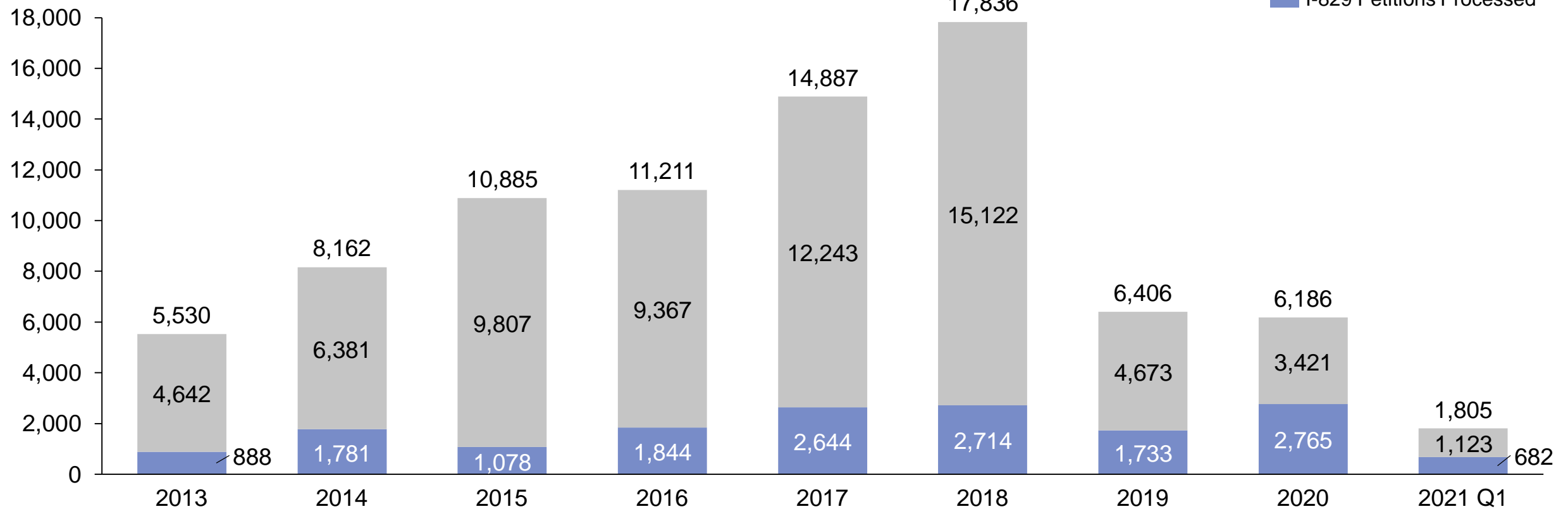

I-526 and I-829 Petitions Processed (Approvals & Denials)

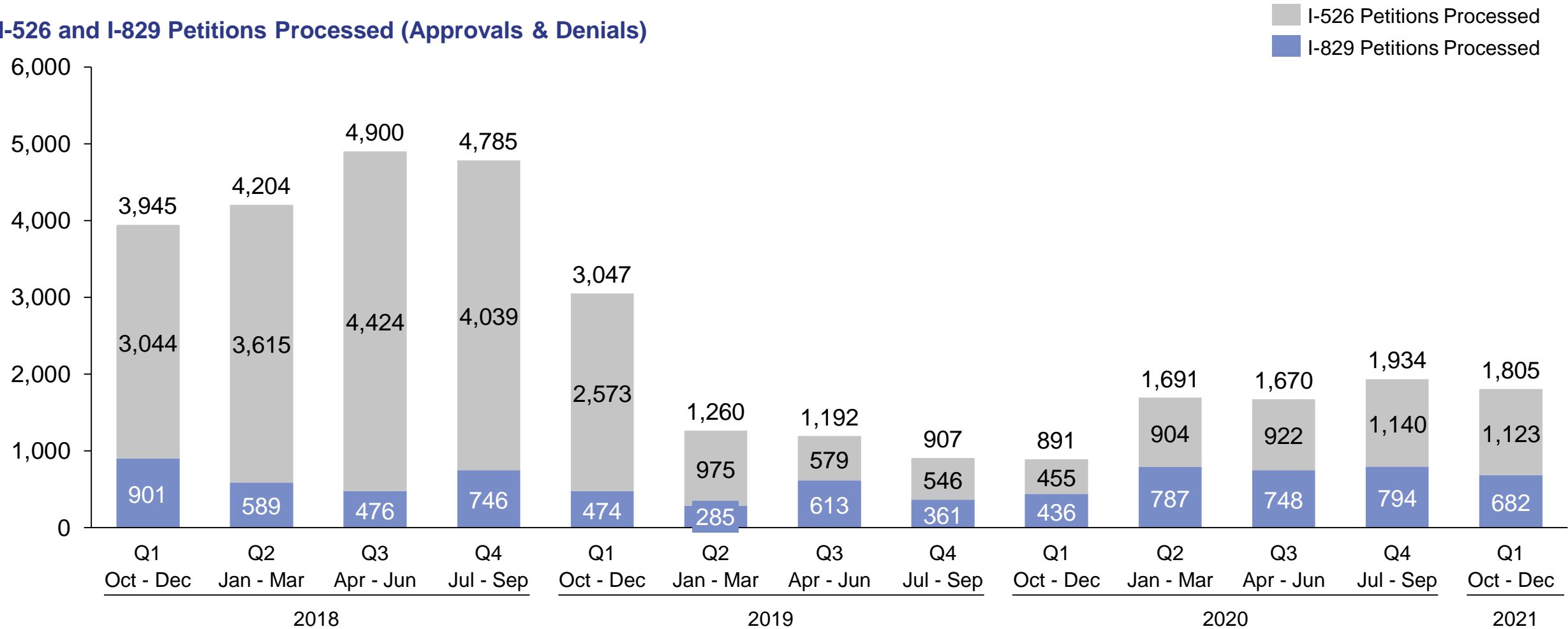

By quarter, FY2018–2021 Q1

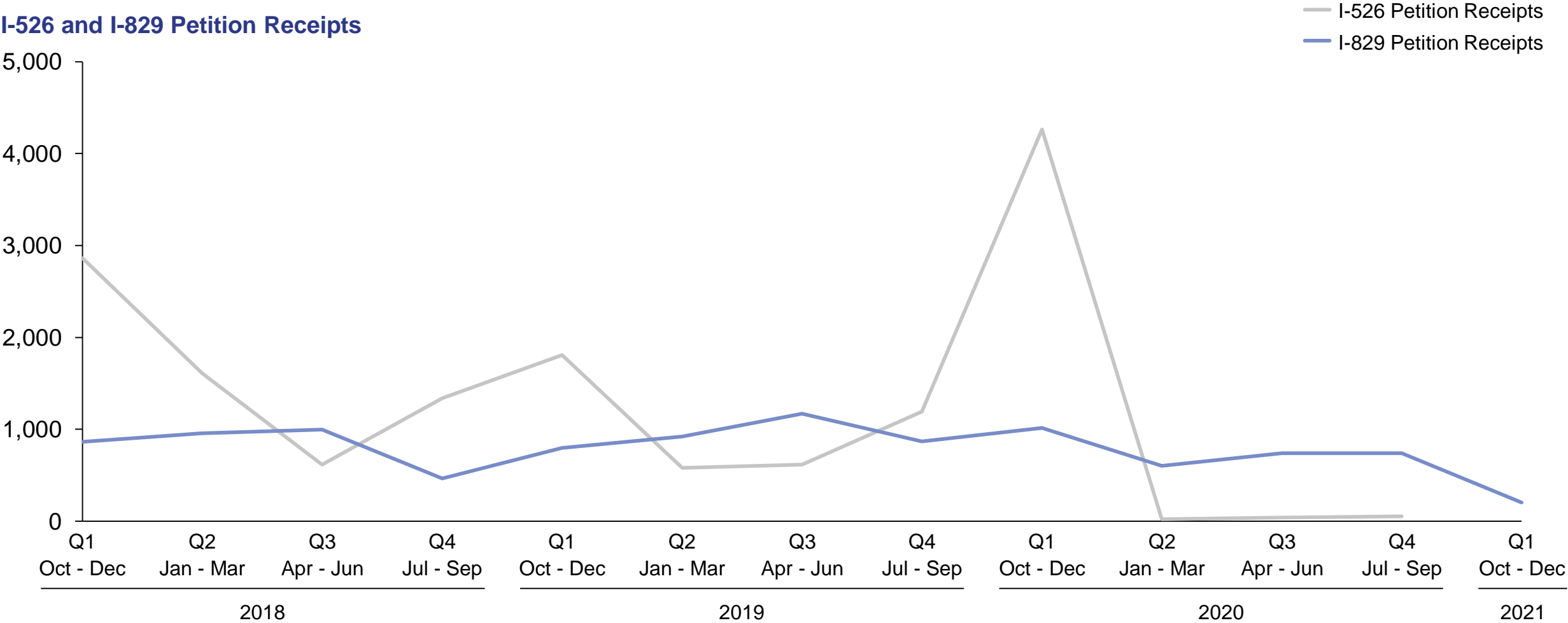
I-526 and I-829 Petitions Processed (Approvals & Denials)

By quarter, FY2018–2021 Q1

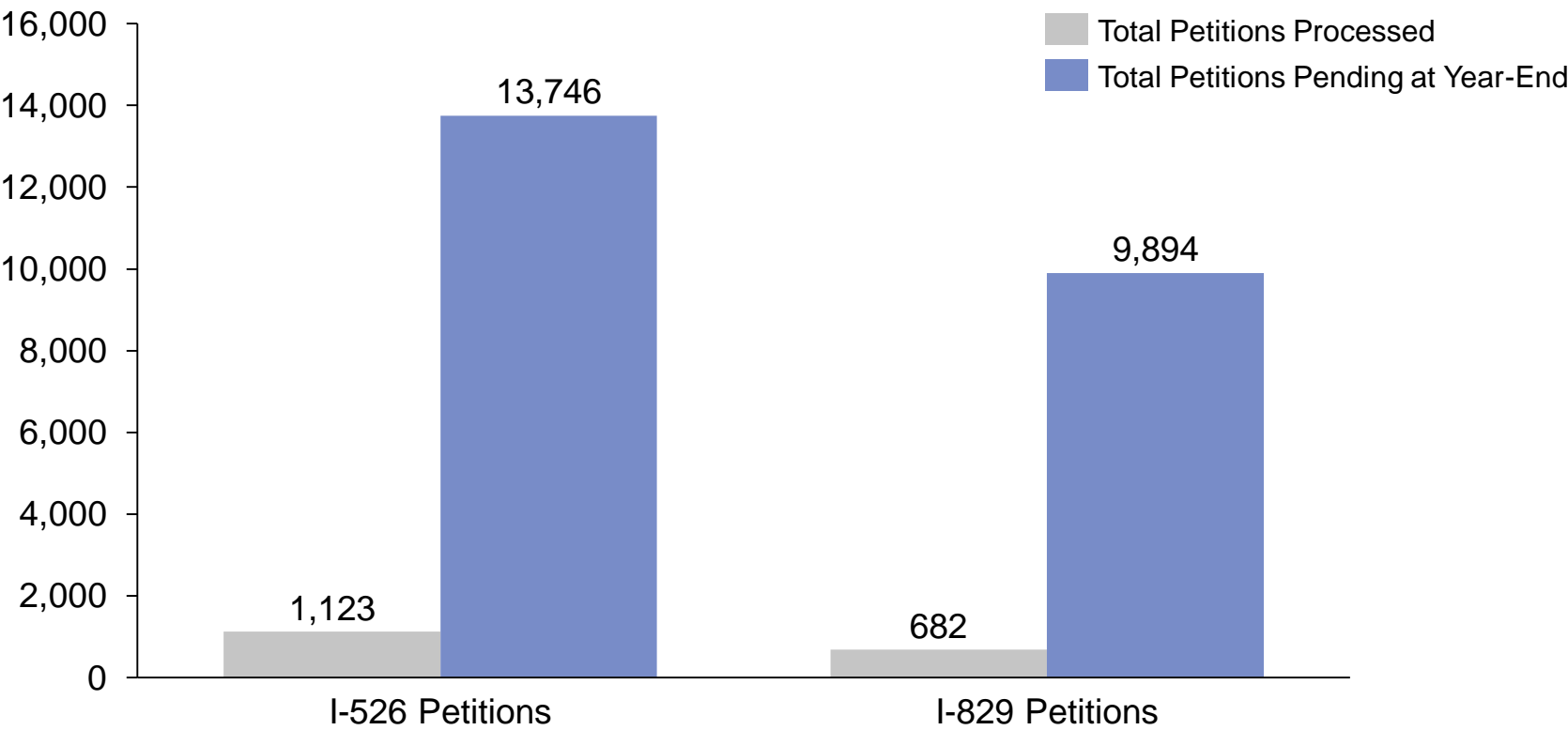

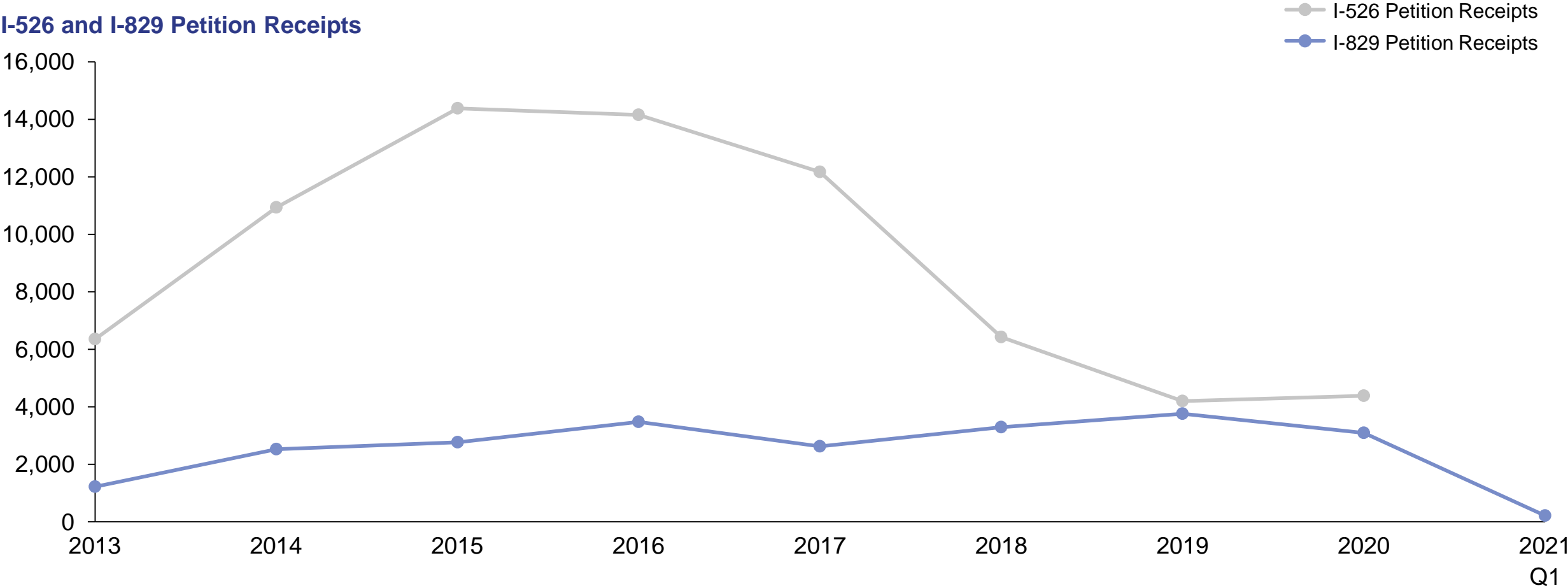
I-526 and I-829 Petitions Processed and Pending FY2021 Q1

By fiscal year, FY2013–2021 Q1

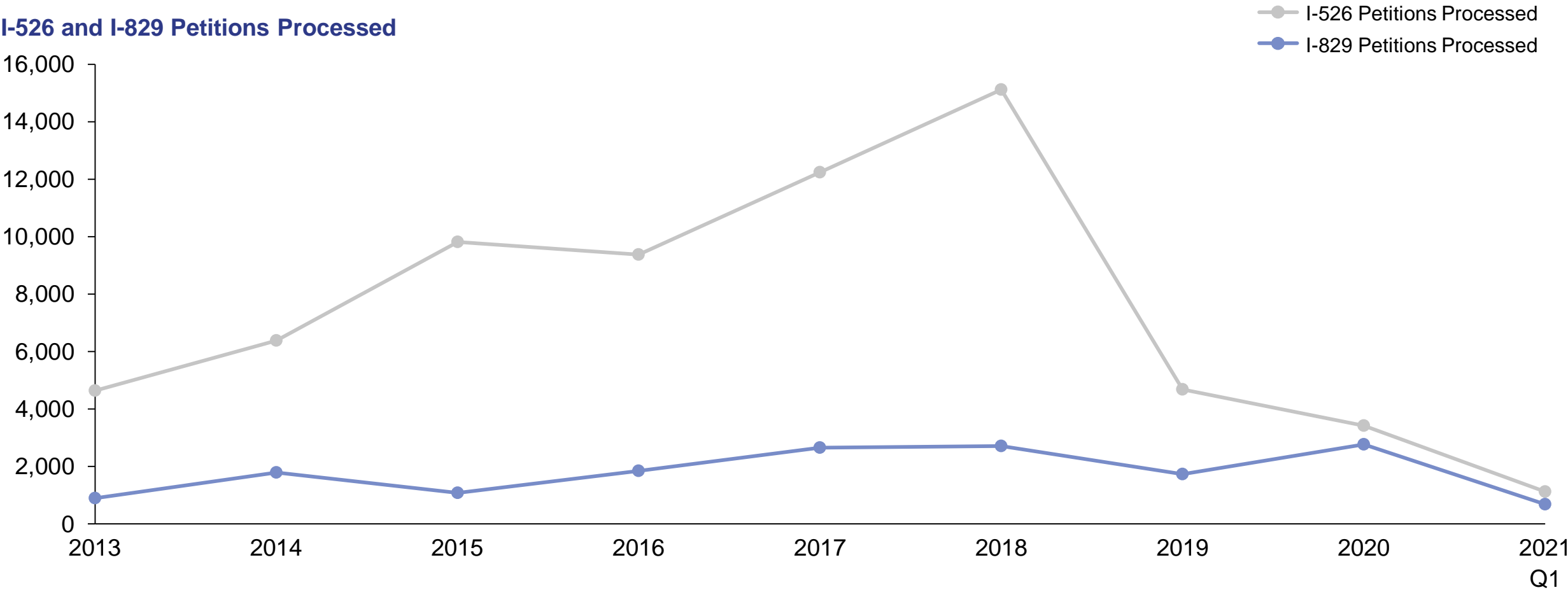

I-526 and I-829 Petitions Processed

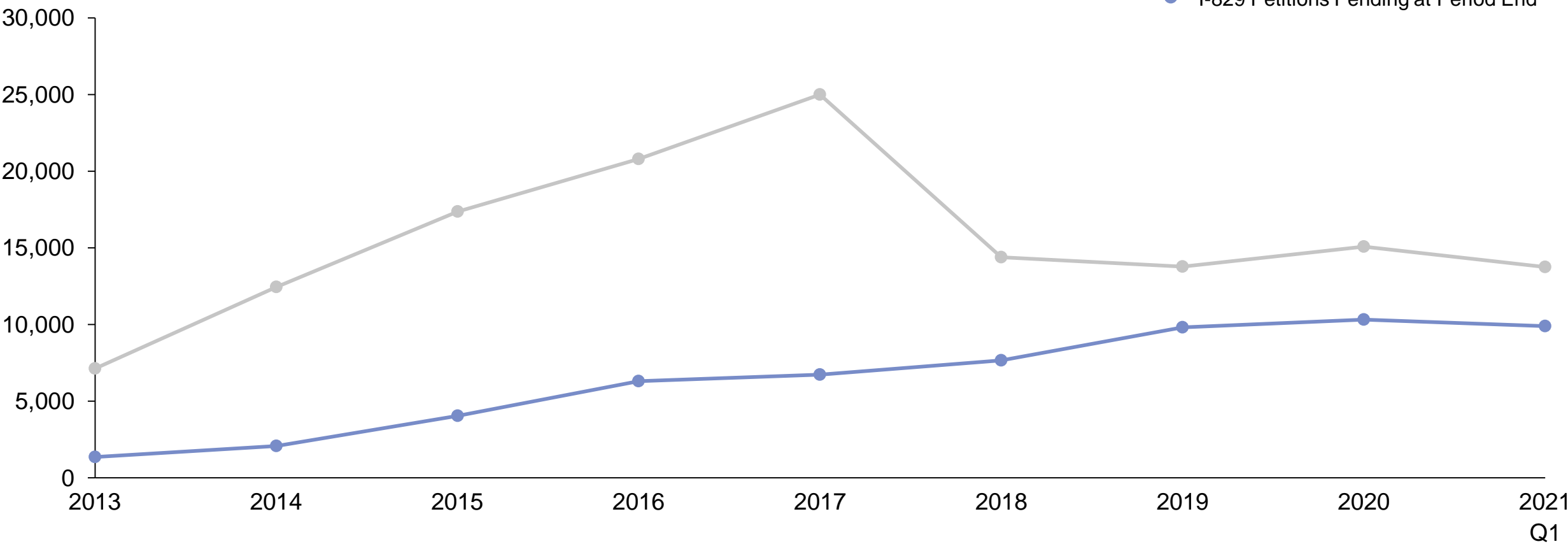
